A-LEVEL LANGUAGES FRENCH, GERMAN, SPANISH

What will I be studying at AS and A-level in Spanish, French and German?

The course covers the following themes:

Aspects of Society

Modern and traditional values, cyberspace and equal rights

Artistic culture

Modern day idols, regional identity, cultural heritage or the cultural landscape

Multiculturalism

Current situation in the target language country

Political Life

Political life, including youth politics, in the target language country

The study of two books, plays or films (from a set list)

Grammatical structures

In addition to your language lessons, you will have individual lessons on a weekly basis with the assistant to improve your spoken language skills.

So what does the exam involve?

Paper 1—2 hours 30 minutes

Listening, reading and translation activities based on the cultural and social life of the relevant countries.

Paper 2—2 hours

An essay on each of 2 books, or 1 book and 1 film, chosen from a prescribed list. There is a choice of essays on each work.

Paper 3 (Speaking) - approx. 17 minutes

Discussion of a stimulus card followed by a presentation and discussions of an individual research project.
