Dear Parents

As ever, I would like to start this letter by asking you to reiterate my thanks to your children for their commitment and contribution to what has been an extremely busy School Term. Quite how they managed to fit in everything I will never know; from end of unit tests, preparation for trial examinations and university preparation, to taking main roles in the Senior School production or performing in music concerts (in the case of some, both) at the same time as playing for a sports team or representing The Grove in another way. I would also like you to thank them for the help they always offer, with great humour and loyalty, whenever we hold Open Days, prospective parent visits and School events, for parents and the public. When visitors write to me to thank the School for running one event or another, they invariably praise the young people who chatted to them or provided a tour.

In the ever-changing political and economic landscape, Independent Schools face unprecedented challenges, including: the nebulous uncertainty of Government-driven initiatives; the continued implications of Brexit; a national teacher recruitment and retention crisis; spiralling costs; the loss of mandatory business rate relief; the prospect of VAT on school fees and the evermore demanding push and pull of Inspection. However, all this uncertainty should not distract us from what is really important; namely, our young people. Notwithstanding all of the challenges that lie ahead, for the time being at least, The Grove continues to thrive and there is no lack of interest in parents seeking places for their children. It is an impressive and hugely encouraging fact that during the course of this Term alone, we have welcomed over three hundred prospective pupils and their families to Open Events and private tours of the School.

At every level our students are making what they will one day realise have been significant academic strides, as well as being involved in a multiplicity of activities. The School is ambitious for all its young people, all of whom are encouraged and challenged to make the very most of their talents and the huge opportunities available. Woodhouse Grove is a school of breadth and opportunity, much of which is regularly showcased in our fortnightly editions of <u>Newsflash</u> and the latest publication of <u>News From The Grove</u>. I am delighted that a very large number of our students have once again been participating in such a rich and varied programme of co-curricular activities. As always, the Autumn Term has seen a wide variety of activity, ranging from the usual plethora of musical, sporting and drama opportunities not to mention various inter-House competitions.

This year's Senior School production of **Remember Me** was a truly exceptional achievement. From start to finish, the production was packed with scenes and songs that were performed with boundless energy, passion and positivity. The quality of the musical numbers and the powerful messages about survival and personal growth conveyed in the literary scenes were quite outstanding. Likewise, those members of the cast who performed solos and soliloquys, some of which were their own compositions, were truly
