BTEC National Extended Certificate in Enterprise and Entrepreneurship

This course will equip you with the skills and confidence that will allow you to set up and run your own business in the future.

It can give you the opportunity to progress into university to continue to study in a business or enterprise related area.

If the university route is not for you, with this qualification, you will also have the option to move straight into employment or a higher-level apprenticeship.

To do some preparation prior to starting the course will be very useful for you; it is recommended that you do a range of things such as:

- Keeping up to date with news related to business
- Watch a range of episodes of Dragon's Den to understand what makes a successful entrepreneur and identify what motivates individuals to become an entrepreneur.
- Read an autobiography of a successful entrepreneur for example Richard Branson, Peter Jones, Karen Brady, Alan Sugar etc.

In your first year of studying enterprise and entrepreneurship, you will complete:

- Unit 1: Enterprise and Entrepreneurs (this unit is internally assessed via courseworkbased assessment)
- Unit 2: Developing a Marketing Campaign (this unit is assessed via a 3-hour controlled piece of assessment)

Preparation for Unit 1.

Task 1: Research Project: Investigate an Entrepreneur.

Prepare a fact sheet based upon an entrepreneur of your choice. Within this include an outline of their business, an overview of their background and their journey to where they are now. Include what motivated them to start their own business and the secret to their success. Include information about what challenges they have faced along the way and more importantly, how they overcame them.

Task 2: Enterprise Exploration Challenge

Do you think that you have what it takes to be a successful entrepreneur in the future, or do you think that you would be more suited to becoming a valued employee of a successful business?

Whatever you decide, it is important to recognise your strengths and skills so that you can 'sell yourself' in the future, but also work on developing skills that you may need when you enter the 'real world of business'

- 3. Create a new product to add to the current product range for Dunkin Donuts.


Task 2: The secret behind Coca-Cola's Marketing Strategy






Glengarry Glen Ross" (1992)
