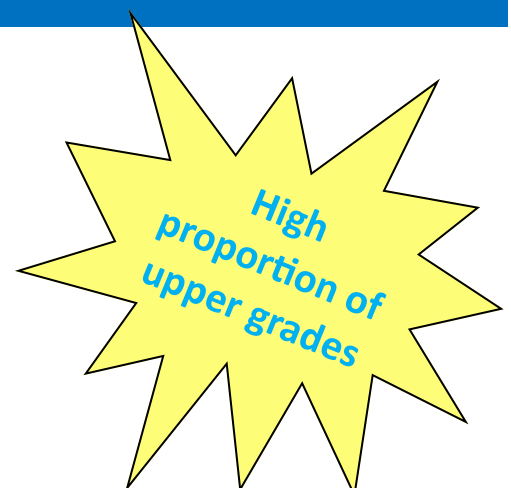
Geographers are among the most employable people. Geography bridges science and human disciplines and so combines well with all other Sixth Form subjects.

# Subject Specification

## AQA A-level Geography

### **Component 1 - Physical Geography**

Students complete an individual investigation which must include data collected in the field. The individual investigation must be based on a question or issue defined and developed by the student relating to any part of the specification content.

# Fieldwork

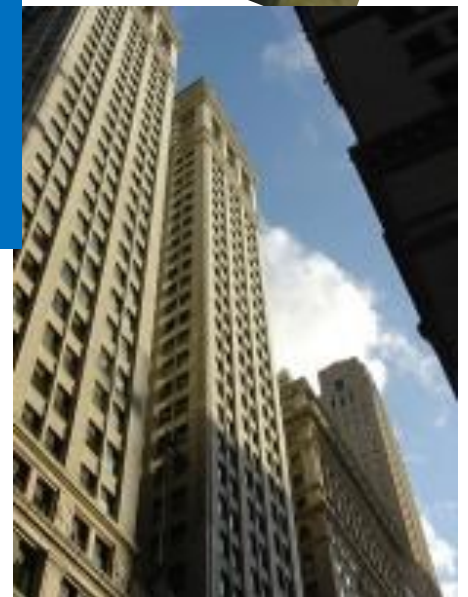
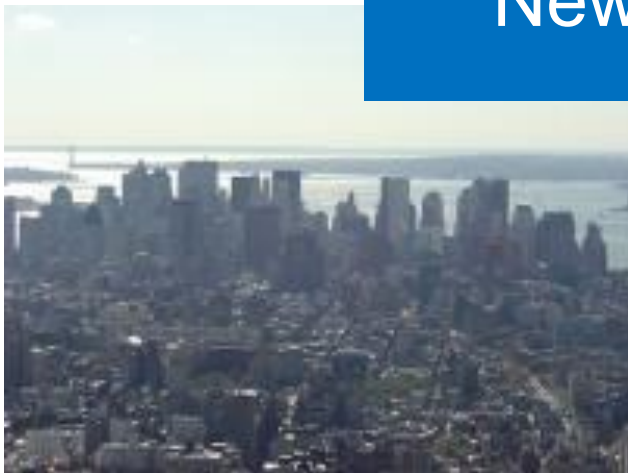
Participate in 4 days of fieldwork which could include:
