EDUQAS A Level Drama and Theatre

COMPONENT 1: THEATRE WORKSHOP (60 marks, 20% of A Level)

NEA: internally assessed, externally moderated

You will take part in the creation, development and performance of a piece of theatre based on a REINTERPRETATION of an extract from a text.

Assessment:

- A creative log which fully justifies decisions made during your process. 1200-1500 words.
- A final group performance where you are assessed either as a PERFORMER or a DESIGNER

COMPONENT 2: TEXT IN ACTION (120 marks, 40% of A Level)

NEA: externally assessed

You will take part in the creation, development and performance of TWO pieces of theatre(one devised and one scripted) based on a stimulus supplied by EDUQAS.

Assessment:

- Final devised performance where you are assessed as either a PERFORMER or a DESIGNER
- Final scripted performance where you are assessed as either a PERFORMER or a DESIGNER
- A process and evaluation report produced in the week following the performance. 3 sections, 3000 words total.

COMPONENT 3- TEXT IN PERFORMANCE (120 marks, 40% of A Level)

Written Examination: 2 hours 30 minutes

You will study three texts from the point of view of a performer, designer and director. You will answer extended essay style questions about each or the texts. For WGS students taking exams in 2027 and beyond, the set texts will be:

- Home I'm Darling by Laura Wade
- *The Bacchae* by Euripides
- The Book of Dust- La Belle Sauvage Adapted by Bryony Lavery
